Important points: ALCOHOL POLICY

PubCycle's permit allows groups to enjoy beer, wine, or cider while in motion aboard the bikes, with stringent laws that we are obligated to enforce. All guests of legal age can bring beer, cider, and wine aboard our bikes. All drinks must be consumed in a plastic or non-breakable cup or bottle. Glass is prohibited. Alcohol MAY NOT leave the bike at any time unless properly purchased, sealed, and stowed. There is a maximum of SIX 12-16 oz. cans/bottles of beer/cider per person or ONE 750-ml bottle/box of wine.

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
